What an Academic Advisor Does for You

In your advising appointments, your advisor will collaborate with you to define and articulate your larger academic and career goals and to shape your coursework each semester in ways that furthers these goals. Beyond specific academic concerns, your advisor will help you navigate NYU's broad spectrum of policies, procedures, and resources, and, when necessary, will serve as a source of comprehensive information about university-wide student support services. You should consider your advisor as a "go to" person who is there to assist you with any concerns or issues that arise throughout your undergraduate experience.

	Schedule an appointment to meet with your advisor well in advance of your registration time in order to enroll
	in courses

Advisor and Advisee Responsibilities

Advisor

- Facilitate discussion regarding your goals academically, professionally, and personally
- Assist you in creating a plan to achieve these goals
- Be an active listener in discussions and provide information and feedback for questions and concerns
- Facilitate an environment that is safe, respectful, and confidential
- Work together to monitor progress toward degree completion
- Clearly explain institutional policies and procedures to guide you through your academic career
- Keep record of your academic goals and interests
- Respond to email inquiries within two business days
- Refer you to University services when appropriate

Advisee

- Regularly check your NYU email account, read emails from your advisor thoroughly, and respond to emails promptly
- Schedule and attend appointments with your academic advisor
- Attend meetings ready to participate, with questions and ideas prepared
- Use advising tools and University resources, particularly those suggested by your advisor, in order to make informed decisions
- Know and understand the requirements of your CAS degree
- Be open and flexible with your options
- Understand the role that institutional policies and procedures, CAS requirements, and departmental requirements play in your academic experience
- Accept responsibilities for decisions and actions that affect your academic career
