### **Global Liberal Studies Overview**

Please refer to the Virtual Advising Presentation for information about the CAS Core and academic policies and requirements.

If you are an internal transfer student from the Global Liberal Studies (GLS) program, you have possible benefits and exemptions from the CAS Core curriculum, based on the LS/GLS Core classes you have taken. Some of these courses, singularly or in combination, will satisfy CAS Core.

NOTE: If you did not complete the **exact** courses listed here, there are no exceptions. You must then default to the CAS Core requirements as specified in the Virtual Advising Presentation and CAS Core website. You are NOT allowed to take these –UF courses once you are a CAS student.

### **CAS Core Curriculum**

- 1. First-Year Seminar (Waived for ALL transfers)
- 2. Expository Writing
- 3. Foreign Language
- 4. Foundations of Contemporary Culture (4 courses):
  - I. Texts & Ideas
  - II. Cultures & Contexts
  - III. Societies & the Social Sciences
  - IV. Expressive Culture

### 5. Foundations of Scientific Inquiry (3 courses):

- I. Quantitative Reasoning
- II. Physical Science
- III. Life Science

You must complete <u>each</u> of these individual requirements.

# GLS/LS CORE – CAS Core equivalencies

CAS Core Requirement	GLS/LS Core Course
Expository Writing	Writing as Exploration + Writing as Critical Inquiry (formerly Writing I + II)
Texts & Ideas	Arts and Cultures 101 + 102 (formerly CF I + II)
Cultures & Contexts	Arts and Cultures + Global Works and Society Sequences (formerly CF I, II, III + SF I, II, III) OR Global Cultures course (GC-UF 101: African, East Asian, Latin American, Middle Eastern, South Asian)
Societies & the Social Sciences	Global Works and Society Sequence (formerly SF I, II, III)
Expressive Culture	Arts and Cultures Sequence (formerly CF I, II, III)
Physical Science	History of the Universe <u>OR</u> Science of Technology
Life Science	Environmental Studies <u>OR</u> Life Science

# **Other CAS Core Options**

If you did not take the courses listed in the previous slide, please refer to the CAS Virtual Advising Presentation and Core website for the various ways to satisfy the CAS Core curriculum.

Some options involve taking designated courses, or by completing specific majors or minors.

## **Majors Equivalencies**

Some CAS majors allow for GLS/LS courses to count towards major requirements:

**Art History:** Arts and Cultures 101 + 102 = 1 major elective

Dramatic Literature: 2 courses toward the major, provided you received a C or higher in Arts and

Cultures 101 + 102

**English:** 2 courses toward the major, provided you received a C or higher in the full Arts and

Cultures Sequence

**Environmental Studies:** ENSTU-UA 101 (Environmental Studies) counts toward the major

**European & Mediterranean Studies:** Arts and Cultures + Global Works and Society Sequences = 2

courses toward the major

**History:** Global Works and Society 101 + 102 + 201 = 3 courses toward the major

**Politics:** Global Works and Society 101 + 102 = 1 major/minor elective

**Public Policy:** Global Works and Society 101 + 201 = Ethics & Justice requirement for the major

Key takeaway: Discuss the specifics with your major advisor!
